ADMISSIONS

If you're touring on a weekday, stop by our Office of Undergraduate Admissions and say hello! Located at the riverside entrance of Decary Hall, our office is open Monday–Friday from 8 a.m.– 4:30 p.m.



KETCHUM LIBRARY

The Jack S. Ketchum Library is open 24/7 and offers both quiet study and group study spaces. Step inside the main entrance, and you'll see the art gallery, where regular art exhibitions and book discussions are hosted.



RIPICH COMMONS

The Danielle N. Ripich Commons is a hub of student activity during the academic year. Students enjoy amenities including pool tables and fireplaces to gather around, a dining hall and campus pub, study spaces, and academic support services. This eco-friendly building reflects UNE's commitment to sustainability and features bird-safe glass, regionally sourced materials, a living wall, and solar panels.



FEATHERMAN HALL

Featherman Hall is one of several first-year residence halls and includes double- and triple-occupancy rooms. Common amenities include a full kitchen, lounge space on each floor, study rooms, and laundry room.



GIRARD MARINE SCIENCE CENTER

The Arthur P. Girard Marine Science Center is the home of UNE's marine science program, boasting top-notch seawater facilities, laboratories, classrooms and offices right in the heart of the Biddeford Campus. Located where the Saco River meets the Atlantic Ocean, the MSC is just steps from UNE's private beach as well as the research vessel dock.



CAMPUS CENTER

The Campus Center is home to a gym, fitness center, six-lane pool, group exercise room, locker rooms, and saunas, as well as the campus bookstore. The Campus Center is also home to the Outdoor Recreation program, which offers opportunities to go hiking, kayaking, paddle boarding, rock climbing, snowshoeing, and more. However you like to move, you can find what you're looking for in the Campus Center.



THE QUAD

The first-year Quad is made up of four residence halls: Assisi, Avila, Siena, and Padua Halls. Quad buildings are traditional-style residence halls with double and triple rooms located on each floor. These buildings are named in historic reference for when the University was St. Francis College. Each building name is a place in Italy that St. Francis traveled.



SOKOKIS HALL

Sokokis Hall is a four-floor, suite-style residence hall with single and double rooms. Suites are four-person with one double room and two single rooms, or four-person with four single rooms. Each suite also has a common area, two bathrooms, and a kitchenette area with full refrigerator, microwave, countertops, and cabinets. This residence hall is named in honor of the Sokokis tribe that would settle into the Biddeford and Saco area periodically to fish.



ALFOND FORUM

The Harold Alfond Forum is a state-of-the-art athletic facility that provides UNE's student-athletes with outstanding amenities, including a 900-seat NHL-sized hockey rink, a 1,200-seat basketball court, multipurpose indoor practice courts, modern locker rooms and a fitness center. The Alfond Forum also houses and provides premier facilities for UNE's Athletic Training and Applied Exercise Science programs, with custom-designed teaching and laboratory space.
