This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of November 21st in which you inquire as to whether or not we might be able to obtain a flush and water tank for you, in view of the fact, that your present one is not working properly due to the fact that the water tank is damaged.

All requests for any type of assistance or aid should, of course, be directed to Mr. Hiram Hall, Indian Supervisor. However, there are no provisions in our appropriations for the furnishing of such items. We did, of course, assist in repairing your line which was plugged previously.

Incidentally, I note from State Office records that you did not re-apply for Medical Aid for the Aged when your previous application expired on June 30, 1963 and I would suggest that you obtain an application from Mr. Hall and re-apply in the event that you may be in need of hospitalization within the next year.
