

Response Options and Potential Remedies

There are many options available to students or staff who bring forward a Title IX related complaint. The wishes of the reporter are honored as closely as possible. Once the reporter meets with the Title IX Coordinator or Deputy Coordinator any of the following remedies or combination of remedies are available to the complainant:

- Information can and will be kept as **private** as possible.
- A University **No Contact Order** can be instituted. This limits the ability of the responding party to have any contact with the complainant.
- **Mediation***: Trained staff can assist students in discussing the concerning behavior and its impact.
- A **conversation** with the respondent informing them of how their behavior may be impacting others.
- The **University Student Conduct Process**. [Website](#)
- Referral to **UNE Counseling Services**. This is a free service to students.
- Change in **class schedule**.
- Change in **room assignments** for residential students.
- Change in **field placement or supervision**.
- Assistance with contacting **local law enforcement**.
- **Nothing**. Sometimes a student just wants to tell their story and find out about their resources and then asks the University to not engage in any formal or informal process.
- There may even be other remedies available depending on the situation.
